CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

We follow CBSE curriculum through new age teaching and learning methodologies and pedagogies, encouraging learners to become confident and independent thinkers. We aim to support our learners through a well planned environment and develop each child's potential through activities that promote independence of thought, physical coordination, emotional growth, social competence, cognitive preparation and spiritual nourishment.

Pre -primary School (Pre-Nursery to Kindergarten)

GD Goenka Signature School follows the Montessori and experiential methods of teaching in the Pre-primary classes.

The Montessori method is a scientific, child-centric educational approach based on scientific observations of children from birth to adulthood. It was formed based on observations made on individuals, from childhood to adulthood and has been successfully implemented for over a century in a variety of cultures across the globe.

Montessori method upholds the human spirit and ensures the complete development of the child in physical, social, emotional as well as cognitive domains.

We have specially designed classrooms supporting kindergarten activities like role play, experiential activities, skills of phonetics which enable the child to entrench the basics of language, mathematical concepts and general knowledge. A strong child centered curriculum prepares the child to question, analyze, classify and communicate his or her perceptions. Peer group interactions, art and craft activities, music lessons and structured story telling sessions, along with a well equipped playground, gives a well rounded learning environment. The stimulating and caring environment of GD Goenka Signature School provides young learners, a contemporary educational experience.

Primary School (Grades 1 to 5)

For an exciting and dynamic range of academic and co-curricular activities, the **Real World Curriculum** provides practical experience covering concepts of language, numeracy, science, value education, physical and art education, combined with structured curriculum of sports and games. Project oriented digital tools infused with STEAM based learning enriches the teaching learning process. Excursions, exhibitions, workshops further enrich the transaction of the curriculum.

The school also provides language learning through the language lab activities. Performing and Visual Arts enable the students to express themselves creatively and appreciate sensitivity and appreciation for the diverse kinds of arts. Theatre in education, works in the areas of pre-vocal work, relaxation posture and breathing, vocal techniques, diction and pronunciation and most importantly confidence. Music is a great experience, which transcends the individual from natural to the supernatural. Music lessons are forms of expression and development of skills which give immense joy to the learner. Through dance, students express the physical manifestation of creativity. The school provides tremendous opportunities for sports and games like swimming, basketball, athletics, football, tennis, table tennis, badminton, squash, volleyball, badminton. The children improve their physio-motor skills, gross motor coordination, speed endurance and flexibility, developing in them team work and healthy competitiveness.

The school offers French and Spanish languages as third language options from Grades 5 to 8.

Middle and Senior School (Grades 6 to 11)

Holistic education is at the heart of our vision- a vision to become an exemplary student-focused school that is regarded for the competence and character of its students, programs and learning environment. In the Middle Years Programme we aim to equip the students to be discerning individuals who can combat future challenges. The child now begins to delve into the modern technology. The school apart from the core CBSE Curriculum transacts learning through Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics Learning (STEAM), Robotics, Artificial Intelligence, Interdisciplinary learning, Project and Design learning. Well equipped labs of Science, Computer, Language, and Mathematics support the well planned structured learning programme. Intellectual curiosity, independent and innovative thinking is fuelled through workshops, debates, discussions, talks,

MUN Programmes. Visits and excursions facilitate learning allowing children to experience the real world. A significant sports programme, sports tournaments, specialized game based coaching further maximize physical development. Art, Science, Math and IT exhibitions enable students to research, explore and initiate key areas of learning which will enable them to succeed in the 21st century paradigm. Life skill and community projects as a formal program begin in Grade 3 and are a part of curriculum until the student graduates from school. Community projects and programs sensitize young learners and instil a sense of responsibility beyond themselves to the country to humanity at large. We offer all the three streams- **Science, Commerce and Humanities** at the Senior Secondary Levels offering a wide range of subject options.

As in the global arena, having a holistic perspective is imperative; the **Real World Curriculum** lays equal emphasis on Academic Knowledge, 21st Century skills, world studies and personal development.

EVENING TUITION AT HOSTEL

- Evening Tutorials / remedial is the USB of the hostel facility, where only hostel boarders are getting day to day basis revision, remedial and extra support with the respective subject teachers.
- Attending evening tuition is compulsory for all the boarders, the tuition timings to be followed strictly.
- Students are strictly instructed to adhere to the tuition timings; late comers will be punished by teachers; it may result cancellation of recreation or sports timings.
- Daily, weekly, monthly or surprise test would be conducted by the teachers and the marks would be shared with principal and parents, time to time by houseparent.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

The students will receive the school annual calendar enclosed in their school almanac. Parents are encouraged to check the dates of the public, school holidays, events, vacations, etc. A hard copy of the holidays & vacations is enclosed in the handbook. Any changes will be duly notified.

CO-CURRICULAR ACITIVITIES

Education at GD Goenka Signature School goes beyond the four walls of the classroom. All students, without exception participate in co-curricular activities. Weekend activities include in-house and out of campus activities.

At all times the students safety is our foremost concern, however, the school cannot be held responsible for injury caused due to any accidents during school trips outside school campus and activities inside the school campus.

SPORTS

GD Goenka Signature School students experience a well-structured sports program. Besides special training programmes in **Basketball, Football, Swimming, Taekwondo, Squash, Table Tennis, Badminton, Tennis, Cricket and Volleyball**, the school renders our students the international experience of sports.

MUSIC & DANCE

The school teaches the music curriculum of the Trinity School, London for the instruments — guitar & electronic synthesizer. The students are also exposed to various forms of dance, which forms an integral part of learning. All students have to opt for one musical instrument to learn and appear for the exams at the end of the session. Musical instruments

will be purchased by the parents.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

The school assembly shall be conducted once a week as an interactive platform to showcase talents, practising public speaking and mutual learning among all members of the school. Each class is assigned a slot to present the morning assembly.

SCHOOL LIBRARY

The school library is stocked with books, journals, magazines and digital content for different age groups and interests. All students have access to the library and books are issued on a regular basis.

Books will be issued for a period of one week.

In the event of a damaged or missing book, the parents concerned are requested to do justice to the library by substituting the book in question with a new copy at their own expense.

ADMITTANCE TO HOSTEL

The admittance to hostel will be permitted on submission of the Admit Pass which will be issued after all the formalities are completed.

BOARDING ROOMS

Spacious rooms are shared between four students with attached toilets and a sit out area. Every student has an independent cupboard. Toiletries, stationery and other materials can be purchased from the school store on request, on a chargeable basis.

MEALS ON CAMPUS

Students are served a healthy breakfast and a buffet lunch with adequate care to ensure that a nutritious, tasty and balanced diet is served.

A buffet dinner will also be made available for the boarders as per the set schedule.

Parents are requested to notify the school in writing if the child suffers from any specific allergies in order for us to take adequate precautions as and when required. Meals are compulsory for all students where they not only learn the social skills but are also groomed for dining etiquette.

STUDENT'S ATTENDANCE

Students must be punctual and reach the school before the scheduled time. CBSE states that 75% attendance is mandatory for the students to appear for the examination. However, certain relaxation is provided in case of medical and other emergencies.

Parents are requested to notify the school in case of a student's planned absence, including hospital visits, family celebrations, etc. for a day or two.

In case a student must accompany his/her parents on vacations, travels etc., the parents are requested to intimate the school at least a week prior to the planned trip.

Student's absence from school for one or more weeks during any part of the academic year is discouraged as this negatively impacts the student's academic development.

In case of illness, kindly ensure that your child has recovered fully before rejoining school hostel.

It is necessary to submit a medical cum fitness certificate confirming that the student is fit to come to school hostel.

UNIFORM

The school uniform is designed to generate a sense of belonging amongst students and provide comfort and flexibility during all school activities. All students of the World GD Goenka Signature School are required to conform to the uniform rules and guidelines.

- Students must wear their uniform with pride and ensure that they look neat, tidy and presentable at all times.
- I-Card for all and hair band for girls are an integral part of the uniform and must be worn at all times.
- Students are required to attend all school functions/activities, Open House, PTM in or outside the school in school uniform only.
- Bloomers (with elastic on thighs) are compulsory for girls from classes IV to X.
- It is mandatory for girls to wear stockings with their winter uniform.
- Students are required to wear shirts and tunics/skirts/track pants as per the design specifications of the prescribed uniform supplied by the books and uniform shop.
- Students are required to wear shoes provided by the school books and uniform shop.
- Girls are not allowed to apply henna on their hands. They are not allowed to wear earrings or rings on fingers or nose rings. However, a pair of small ear studs is permitted.
- Girls with long hair should plait their hair. It is mandatory for girls to wear hair bands in the school campus, inside the bus as well as outside the school campus while representing the school. Failure to follow the rule will result in suspension from school. Colouring or bleaching of hair is not permitted.
- Sikh boys of Nursery and Prep must wear red-coloured patkas .

SAFETY AND SECURITY

The school is enclosed with a boundary wall with a single entry/exit manned by security personnel 24 hours.

Visitors are required to make an entry in the register at the main gate for monitoring and record keeping.

Considering the safety of the children, only cars and other vehicles with permission are allowed to enter the school premises. Parking slots have been designated near the entrance to facilitate ease of movement.

Parents/authorized persons who come to pick up their children are requested to show the Disclaimer issued by the school to the security and also at the school reception/ House parent. This is to ensure the safety of your child.

The school building including the hostel is fitted with fire alarms and close circuit camera systems in all common areas and classrooms to enhance safety and security of the students.

The school will not circulate the phone numbers of one parent to another under any circumstances.

MEDICAL FACILITY

The school is equipped with medical facilities and a supply of non-prescription medicines. A trained nurse stays on the campus 24 hours a day. The school has tied up with an international standard private hospital for serious medical problems or emergencies. All medical expenses will be borne by the parent.

Parents are required to fill in the Medical History Form carefully.

DISCIPLINE – CODE OF CONDUCT-

GD Goenka Signature School encourages students to take complete

responsibility for their own self-discipline, studies and personal behaviour. The school does not encourage communalism, sexism, bullying or any insensitive behaviour towards peers or school property.

The school is not associated with any religious or denominational organization.

All students are expected to attend all classes as per the schedule. Absence is only granted after permission has been taken from the Principal/house parent.

Corporal punishments are not encouraged under any circumstances in the school/hostel. Any student found disrespecting the school rules and regulations will be terminated from school with immediate effect.

The school follows a zero tolerance policy for indulgence in use of any kind of banned substances. Any use of tobacco/alcohol/non-prescription drugs will incur strict disciplinary actions and may result in expulsion from school. The school expects all the students to be courteous to their teachers and peers. The school will not allow disrespect of women in any form. Defacing of school property and indulgence in disruptive and abusive behavior will cause disciplinary actions.

DO'S AND DON'TS FOR HOSTEL

- Boarders are expected to display acceptable behavior, maintain discipline and decorum everywhere in general, in and around the hostel campus in particular at all times
- **Ragging is considered as punishable offence** as per F.No. 37-3/Legal/AICTE/2009 regulations. Students should abstain from ragging or such offences as no leniency will be shown to any student found guilty. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, if someone is found guilty he/she would be punished severely.

- Possession, distribution and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages, prohibited drugs or any form of narcotics, chewable tobacco, gambling in hostel and in the school campus is a serious offence and strictly prohibited. Student should not consume alcohol inside or outside and enter into the campus; smoking is strictly prohibited in the hostel and school premises. Non-compliance shall lead to strict disciplinary action and legal authorities shall be informed of violations (This shall apply to visitors also).
- Boarders have to follow the hostel time table strictly, boarders have to report on time for respective activities of hostel as per the hostel schedule.
- All the meals provided as per the hostel schedule are compulsory for all the hostel residence, no student is allowed to skip any meal for whatsoever reasons.
- Trespassing from boys hostel to girls hostel and vice versa is strictly prohibited, disciplinary action shall be taken against the defaulters.
- Decent dress code is to be maintained in the hostel premises, House parents reserve the right to decide appropriateness of the clothes.
- The Hostels shall maintain sleeping hours from 11:00 PM to 06:00 AM. Enough care should be taken to ensure the loud talks audible outside the rooms.
- Students of the allotted rooms shall be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their respective rooms / corridors outside, including furniture.
- Students should enter and leave the hostel building only through designated path / entrances in the campus, house parents reserve the right of the spot checking or frisking.

- Students should handle hostel equipments, furniture and cafeteria property carefully and should not damage it.
- No students shall use the services of the peons, nannies, hostel housekeeping, and person for any kind of personal work.
- Students will not enter in to rooms of other students after 10:00 PM without permission of respective houseparent, no movements in corridors or other rooms would be entertained.
- No function celebration shall be organized at the hostel premises without the written permission of the principal.
- Students acts such as using abusive and threatening language, physical fights, use of force to get unfair act accomplished etc. are punishable, further defaulters are liable to be suspended /expelled from the institution.
- Students are not allowed to take common rooms, newspapers, and magazine to their respective rooms at anytime.
- Hostel accommodation rooms, building can be changed by management if they found the same is necessary at any point of the time.
- No boarders are allowed to change the rooms allotted to them without the prior written permission of the hostel authorities.
- The students are requested to report about any unacceptable behavior they encounter by any of their roommates.
- Students are not allowed to stay in the hostel during school working hours without prior permission of the houseparent / residential nurse.
- Misbehaviour towards security or any support staff will be ebullient to vandalism.
- All complaints related to maintenance to be logged in maintenance

register with particular explanation of problem with location. The maintenance register is always kept at hostel reception for the convenience of the students.

- All complaints related to lost and found to be logged in lost and found register with particular explanation of lost / theft with location and time. The register is always kept at hostel reception for the convenience of the students.

OUTINGS / FIELD TRIPS AT HOSTEL

- Boarders will go for a monthly mall / movie outing or field trip as per hostel calendar. It's compulsory for all the boarders to attend the same, no excuse will be entertained except medical reasons.
- Outing / Field trip / Mall trip can be cancelled / postponed / preponed in case of unavoidable circumstances
- During Exam days no outings will take place
- Outing expenses would be deduced from student's personal impressed account.
- Students are not allowed to go out of outing place without prior permission of houseparent.
- No parent is allowed to pick up, drop or meet their child during outing hours at venue.
- No day boarder's friends, relative or family friends are allowed to meet child at the outing place.
- During Mall and Movie outing students have to follow the strict timings of arrival and departure as per instructions given by the houseparent(s) on duty
- During Movie outing, students need to watch the movie decided by the houseparent(s); no excuse or argument in this regard would

be entertained.

- Limited Cash for shopping and lunch would be provided by school, students have to manage their expenses within this budget only.
- Students can purchase limited snacks, biscuits, chocolates and other ready to eat hot food stuff on day of outing, no energy drinks, cold drinks, maggie, chewing gum are allowed.

CALL POLICY

Students are allowed to bring only a basic mobile phone with sim card. They are allowed to use their basic mobile phones for call turn on **Wednesday night- 08:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Sunday- 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.**

No smart phones (android OS and IOS) will be allowed for weekly boarders/local residents. Usage of social networking is strictly prohibited, if found the phone would be confiscated and will not be returned until completion of the academic year. The students have to submit phone to the house parent(s) with proper identification or tagging. Surprise checking may be done at any time. The phones will be confiscated forever if the students are found misusing it. On emergency occasions, students may use the school phones with the permission of the house parent/house mother.

School is not responsible for any lost or stolen mobile complaints.

EXPENSES AND TRAVEL

Parents are expected to pay all the school fees on time to avoid payment of fine or child's termination.

The school arranges, on request, a transport to all out-station students to and from the airport/railway station according to the vacation schedule listed in the school calendar.

Parents who do not wish to avail this service will be required to make their own travel arrangements including pick-up and drop-off from airport and railway station.

The school shall take the responsibility to book air/rail tickets only on prior information and deposition of money by the parent. Written request is required for all travel arrangements which can be communicated in writing to the house parent in advance.

All foreign students are required to carry copies of their FRRO (Foreign Regional Registration Office) documents themselves.

FEE POLICY

Fee is payable in four installments corresponding to the four Terms.

Fee includes expenses related to books, stationery, annual charges, all school activities (except Annual Day celebration & outdoor adventure programs), food, IT facilities & boarding charges.

Uniform and transport charges are not included in the fee and will be charged additionally.

Fee once paid is non refundable.

In case of a child discontinuing school, the caution deposit will be refunded without any interest.

The Management reserves the right to terminate the student's admission for non-payment of the school fee beyond 15 days from the due date. In such a case, parents will have to re-admit the child after making all required payments.

PAYMENT OF THE FEE

The School Fee is divided into four installments and is to be paid at the start of every term:

1st Term payment to be paid by 10th April of the current academic year

2nd Term payment to be paid by 10th of July

3rd Term payment to be paid by 10th of October

4th Term payment to be paid by 10th of January

Parents are requested to make the payment before the due dates. Late fee payment will be charged @ Rs.100/- per day inclusive of public & school holidays, after the 10th of each payable month.

Parent can also pay the fees at once for the entire academic session if they so wish to.

All payments (school fee, examination fee, transportation fee, IT fee and boarding fee) must be paid by cash / cheque in favour of "**GD Goenka Signature School**". We also accept credit/debit card payments (with the bank convenience charges of 1.5%) and online payment.

All payments will be collected only at the Accounts Office from Monday to Saturday (except on school notified holidays) during school hours.

Imprest Account

An imprest account is maintained for each student. The amount deposited by the parent/guardian will vary from year to year and between grades. It is the house parent's responsibility to maintain the account of each individual boarder in his/her care and to inform the accounts department of such expenditure. Parents would be required to replenish the imprest account as and when required. Instructions for the same would be given by the house parent.

WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL

Parents wishing to withdraw their child/children from school must notify the school for issuance of the School Transfer Certificate and refund of

the caution deposit **thirty working days in advance for non-boarders and ninety working days in advance for boarders** else one quarter fee (inclusive of all charges) will be payable in lieu of notice.. Please note that the caution deposit amount will be refunded without any interest after settling down all fee related dues.

All boarders leaving the school must obtain a **NO DUES FORM** from the Principal's office. Until this has been completed and signed, signifying the return of all school property in good condition, no exit pass, report card or transfer certificate will be issued to the student.

Please note that the Management reserves the right to change the school policies as and when it deems fit.

HOME SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

Parent-Mentor Meetings (PMM)

The PMM shall be scheduled at regular intervals of time all through the year to address specific concerns and progress of child. PMM at regular intervals helps the staff, students and parents to share information. The personal profiles, achievements, attendance records, academic progress, report cards, discipline and sanctions, school communications for your child are shared in the PMM.

Report card will be issued twice a year – in September end for Mid Term exams and final report card in March end of each academic year.

The mentors will have class assessments all through the year at regular intervals.

Newsletters

School newsletters, sent thrice a year, form an important channel of communication between the school and home. These newsletters will usually highlight major events and developments taking place in the

school over last few months.

CELEBRATIONS AT SCHOOL

It is strongly recommended that the candies are the same for the students and staff (counted to a maximum of 2 per person) and worth Rs. 50/- or less per piece. Cutting birthday cakes is not allowed inside the school. Parents are advised to not to distribute cooked outside food to their ward and other students.

All boarders will celebrate their birthdays with other boarders and the house parent at the hostel by cutting a cake, which will be arranged by the school.
